Council of University System Staff Council Meeting Minutes Coppin State University March 27, 2018

1. Call to Order

2. Welcome and Introductions

- a) Anthony Littlejohn (graduate of Coppin) introduced speaker because president (Maria Thomas) nor provost (Leon St. Louis) were able to make it.
- b) Michael Bowden, Asst. Vice President, provided introduction. In 13th year of employment at Coppin. Came from USM office.
- c) Coppin awards over 550 degrees every year; about 400 bachelors degrees and the rest are masters. Recently introduced doctorate program.
- d) Athletics Coppin participates in the Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference (MEAC) and NCAA.
- e) Accreditation seven specialized bodies.
- f) Enrollment 2507 (undergraduate) 386 (graduate). Large population of student body is first-generation students.
- g) Faculty 128 full-time and 129 part-time.
- h) Accreditation has changed from every 10 to every eight years. Coppin recently had accreditation approved (standards recently changed from 14 to seven).

4. Approval of Minutes from January

- a) Trenita Johnson was present at January meeting. Sheila Chase was on the phone; Sonia McCain was not present.

5. Chair's Report

- a) Chancellor's council meeting in March. Many of budget hearings have concluded in legislative session. Capital budget session started last week. System has recommended to remove \$5 million cut. Two bills on sexual assault.
- b) Amazon visit to Maryland waiting to hear back to determine if we make list.
- c) Recommendation to move the Southern MD Higher Ed to USM was positive. Will operate similarly to Shady Grove.
- d) Another issue with disposal of property with Board of Public Works.
- e) Issue with APLU (agriculture) discussed.
- f) Discussion about Nexus courses applying to BA degrees.
- g) City of Salisbury, Maryland, hosting National Folk Festival. Festival will be held September 7-9, 2018. Will host festival through 2020.

8. Committee Reports

a) **Benefits and Compensation**

- 1. Submitted employee discounts to Mark.
- 2. Stacy Utley-Bernhardt had someone from staff senate at her institution (Frostburg) submit something to her regarding domestic partnerships (same-sex and heterosexual) and using leave to care for sick family members. USM policy does not consider a domestic partner a family member.
- 3. Also working on salary compression they have questions for Chevonie regarding salary review.

b) **Board of Regents Awards**

- 1. Thanked Tim Casey for his terrific work on the BOR evaluation process.
- 2. Discussed possibility of using recent process for evaluations.
- 3. Looking for improvements for next year. Lots of feedback regarding improvements centered on training (how many comments should one make?).
- 4. Four people did not do any grading. Two people were exempt. Winners are known, but not finalized.

c) Communications and Marketing

- 1. Discussed upcoming newsletter. POCs will receive email prompting them to send institutional updates. Will highlight Bowie's new president and chair's report.
- 2. Worked on CUSS info sheet and settling on wording. Will be created to take back to institutions if recruitment is needed for CUSS and to pass out to legislators. Will review draft at next meeting.
- 3. Newsletter is set to be finished by end of April. Need institutional updates from POCs by April 25th.
- 4. Mark will send February newsletter to all CUSS members today (3/27/18).

d) Legislative and Policy

- 1. Discussed broadly the charge of the committee and how they can adequately represent USM staff. Will discuss further when more committee members are present.
- 2. Discussed advocacy day briefly. One question that came up was why there was no luncheon with delegates and legislators. Led to conclusion that there is concern regarding whether or not our voice matters.
- 3. Talked about the schedule for Advocacy Day; felt that it worked well.
- 4. Committee will revisit discussion of Advocacy Day to discuss pros and cons and how to prepare CUSS members for the day. CUSS members are encouraged to do their homework on local representatives in preparation for next year. One suggestion was to send out list of who we're visiting earlier in order to prepare.

e) Executive Committee

- 1. Discussed how we would like to create CUSS meeting schedule earlier. Schedule has been created for next year.

9. Old Business

a) Advocacy Day Recap

- 1. Third Wednesday in February has been designated as Advocacy Day going forward.
- 2. Both CUSS and CUSF felt that the day went very well.
- 3. Trish Johnson gave her perspective of Advocacy Day, stating that she appreciated having appointment times with the delegates.
- 4. Sheila Chase stated that she appreciated the talking points.
- 5. Deniz Erman mentioned how in the past we would pass out handouts to the delegates' assistants instead of meeting with them. She mentioned that the delegates she met with provided tips on how to get bills passed.
- a. Jenn Voldberding discussed her meeting with Senator Rich Madaleno, who plans to run for governor.
- 6. It was suggested that we send thank-you cards.

b) Shared Governance Survey Update

- 1. Overall, it was a success (especially on the first run).
- 2. 165 people participated in survey. Good distribution of participation among campuses. Good distribution regarding length of involvement in shared governance. The majority of participants have worked for their institution for more than five years.
- 3. Questions 19, 13 and 20 had highest levels for strongly agree.
- 4. Next three with highest ratings were questions 12, 10 and 1. Same theme: we're able to have shared governance on our campuses that's uninterrupted.
- 5. Lowest ratings: questions 15, 16, 8 and 14. Categories that had highest rate of people voting for disagree and strongly disagree.
- 6. Categories of neither agree nor disagree 60% of people did not agree that we have staff involvement in fiscal planning or involvement in staff selection or hiring.
- 7. General report will be given at BOR meeting in April. Individual reports will be sent to president of each institution. Will also be sent to chair of staff shared governance after being sent to president. All comments on survey are anonymous and will be visible to university presidents.
- 8. Survey will be conducted annually.
- 9. Send any feedback on survey to Mark Freeman.

10. New Business

 Nominations – starting with meeting in April, nominations for Executive Committee will be accepted (except for Member at Large, which is elected during August meeting).
 Nominations will run through May and elections will be held in June.

11. Institution Updates

- 1. UMBC winner of NCAA men's basketball tournament. Also launching seventh cohort of staff mentoring program next week, in which new staff are paired with seasoned staff for a year of mentorship. Lastly, new events center opened in January.
- Frostburg 1985 alumni Ricky Arnold took off for International Space Station. Second time
 on space station. Doing first space walk on March 29th. Will be participating in the Teaching
 from Space Program. He'll be there for five months, returning in August.
- 3. Bowie April will be inauguration of new president.
