

SUMMARY OF ITEM FOR ACTION, INFORMATION OR DISCUSSION

TOPIC: University of Maryland, Baltimore: Dental Student Clinics Management Contract

COMMITTEE: Finance

DATE OF COMMITTEE MEETING: March 25, 2010

SUMMARY: The University of Maryland, Baltimore (UMB) requests approval to exercise the fifth and final one-year renewal option with U.M. FSP Associates, P.A. for the day to day operation of the dental student clinics at the Dental School at UMB. Daily operations include activities such as providing non-faculty support, scheduling patient visits, collecting fees charged to patients for services provided at the clinic and providing materials for operations. The initial contract was approved by the Board of Regents in April 2005.

The estimated dollar value for the coming contract year that begins June 1, 2010 is \$8.502 million. This request for approval is made pursuant to University System of Maryland Procurement Policies and Procedures: Section VII.C.2 for procurements exceeding \$5 million.

<u>ALTERNATIVE(S)</u>: Alternatives have not been explored since FDSP was organized as a tax exempt Maryland Corporation in order to implement a Faculty Dental Service Plan approved by the USM Board of Regents. It is not likely that a for profit commercial entity could perform these required services more economically since FDSP receives no compensation other than transfer of funds from the University to support FDSP's direct costs. The contract will not exceed generated revenues.

FISCAL IMPACT: This contract provides a positive fiscal impact in that FDSP receives no compensation other than reimbursement for personnel expenses and reasonable out-of-pocket expenses that are documented in periodic statements of income and expense to the Dental School.

<u>CHANCELLOR'S RECOMMENDATION</u>: That the Finance Committee recommend that the Board of Regents approve this request for contract renewal with U.M. FDSP Associates, P.A. as above described.
