**TOPIC:** Campus Crime Reports

**COMMITTEE:** Education Policy

**DATE OF COMMITTEE MEETING:** March 16, 2011

**SUMMARY:** The data included in this annual report are drawn from the Campus Security Statistics website of the Office of Postsecondary Education of the U.S. Department of Education. The site was authorized by Congress with the 1998 amendment to the Higher Education Act of 1965 (HEA) to help potential college students and their parents research criminal offenses on college campuses. The Department of Education requires that, by October 1 of each year, each institution that is Title IV eligible is required to publish and distribute an annual campus security report to all current students and employees.

The statistics found on the OPE website represent alleged criminal offenses reported to campus security authorities and/or local police agencies. Therefore, the data collected do not necessarily reflect prosecutions or convictions for crime. Because some statistics are provided by non-police authorities, the data are not directly comparable to data from the FBI's Uniform Crime Reporting System which only collects statistics from police authorities.

The tables on crime reports for 2007, 2008, and 2009 include criminal offenses that occurred on campus. They also include data for on-campus arrests, as well as campus disciplinary actions and judicial referrals, for liquor law violations, drug abuse violations, and illegal weapons possession. (Tables for earlier years are available upon request.) Also attached is a glossary that provides definitions for the various terms used in the reports.

Federal regulations also require separate reporting of hate offenses. Very few hate offenses have occurred at USM institutions over the reporting period, and therefore these have not been displayed in a tabular format. In the three-year period included in this report, only one hate crime occurred – an assault involving bodily injury at UMCP in 2007.

Again this year, in addition to total number of reported incidents, the tables provide a rate that reflects total number of incidents per 1,000 students (based upon fall headcount enrollment) so that crime statistics may be compared appropriately from year to year and between institutions. A trend table showing five years of data (total number of incidents in each category) is included.

## Glossary

Terms	Definitions
Aggravated assault	An unlawful attack by one person upon another for the purpose of inflicting severe or aggravated bodily injury. This type of assault usually is accompanied by the use of a weapon or by means likely to produce death or great bodily harm.
Burglary	The unlawful entry of a structure to commit a felony or a theft.
Motor vehicle theft	The theft or attempted theft of a motor vehicle.
Arson	Any willful or malicious burning or attempt to burn, with or without intent to defraud, a dwelling house, public building, motor vehicle or aircraft, personal property of another, etc.
Hate crime	A crime that manifests evidence that the victim was intentionally selected because of the perpetrator's bias. The applicable categories of bias are: race, gender, religion, sexual orientation, ethnicity/national origin and disability.
On campus	Any building or property owned or controlled by an institution within the same reasonably contiguous geographic area and used by the institution in direct support of, or in a manner related to, the institution's educational purposes, including residence halls; and Any building or property that is within or reasonably contiguous to paragraph (1) of this definition, that is owned by the institution but controlled by another person, is frequently used by students, and supports institutional purposes (such as a food or other retail vendor).
Murder and non-negligent manslaughter	The willful (non-negligent) killing of one human being by another.
Forcible sex offense	Any sexual act directed against another person, forcibly and/or against that person's will; or not forcibly or against the person's will where the victim is incapable of giving consent. <b>A. Forcible rape</b> - The carnal knowledge of a person, forcibly and/or against that person's will; or not forcibly or against the person's will where the victim is incapable of giving consent because of his/her temporary or permanent mental or physical incapacity (or because of his/her youth). <b>B. Forcible sodomy</b> - Oral or anal sexual intercourse with another person, forcibly and/or against that person's will; or not forcibly against the person's will where the victim is incapable of giving consent because of his/her youth or because of his/her temporary or permanent mental or physical incapacity. <b>C. Sexual assault with an object</b> - The use of an object or instrument to unlawfully penetrate, however slightly, the genital or anal opening of the body of another person, forcibly and/or against that person's will; or not forcibly or against the person's will where the victim is incapable of giving consent because of his/her youth or because of his/her temporary or permanent mental or physical incapacity. <b>D. Forcible fondling</b> The touching of the private body parts of another person for the purpose of sexual gratification, forcibly and/or against that

person's will; or, not forcibly or against the person's will where the victim is incapable of giving consent because of his/her youth or because of his/her temporary or permanent mental incapacity.

Liquor law violation	The violation of state or local laws or ordinances prohibiting the manufacture, sale, purchase, transportation, possession, or use of alcoholic beverages, not including driving under the influence and drunkenness. Include in this classification: the manufacture, sale, transporting, furnishing, possessing, etc., of intoxicating liquor; maintaining unlawful drinking places; bootlegging; operating still; furnishing liquor to a minor or intemperate person; underage possession; using a vehicle for illegal transportation of liquor; drinking on train or public conveyance; and attempts to commit any of the above.
Drug law violation	The violation of laws prohibiting the production, distribution and/or use of certain controlled substances and the equipment or devices utilized in their preparation and/or use. The unlawful cultivation, manufacture, distribution, sale, purchase, use, possession, transportation or importation of any controlled drug or narcotic substance. Arrests for violations of state and local laws, specifically those relating to the unlawful possession, sale, use, growing, manufacturing and making of narcotic drugs. The relevant substances include: opium or cocaine and their derivatives (morphine, heroin, codeine); marijuana; synthetic narcotics - manufactured narcotics which can cause true addiction (Demerol, Methadone); and dangerous nonnarcotic drugs (barbiturates, Benzedrine).
Illegal weapons possession	The violation of laws or ordinances prohibiting the manufacture, sale, purchase, transportation, possession, concealment, or use of firearms, cutting instruments, explosives, incendiary devices or other deadly weapons. This classification encompasses weapons offenses that are regulatory in nature. Include in this classification: manufacture, sale or possession of deadly weapons; carrying deadly weapons, concealed or openly; using, manufacturing, etc, of silencers; furnishing deadly weapons to minors; aliens possessing deadly weapons; and attempts to commit any of the above.
Non-forcible sex offenses	Unlawful, non-forcible sexual intercourse. <b>A. Incest</b> - Non-forcible sexual intercourse between persons who are related to each other within the degrees wherein marriage is prohibited by law. <b>B. Statutory rape</b> - Non-forcible sexual intercourse with a person who is under the statutory age of consent.
Robbery	The taking or attempting to take anything of value from the care, custody, or control of a person or persons by force or threat of force or violence and/or by putting the victim in fear.
Arrest	Persons processed by arrest, citation or summons.
Referral for disciplinary action	The referral of any person to any official who initiates a disciplinary action of which a record is kept and which may result in the imposition of a sanction.
Criminal offense	An infraction of law.
