TOWSON UNIVERSITY FISCAL YEAR 2010 ANNUAL REPORT ON INTERCOLLEGIATE ATHLETICS

SECTION A

STATEMENT FROM INSTITUTIONAL PRESIDENT

- Towson University is classified as an NCAA Division I (Football Championship Subdivision) member, competing as a member of the Colonial Athletic Association (CAA) in all sports except women's gymnastics, which competes in the Eastern Collegiate Athletics Conference (ECAC). The university sponsors 13 sports for women and seven for men.
- 2. The mission statement for the Department of Athletics defines the role of the intercollegiate athletics program at this institution. The mission statement was formulated by the Intercollegiate Athletics Committee and approved by the University Senate.
 - Providing intercollegiate sports programs that strengthen educational and developmental experiences for student-athletes, and simultaneously, contribute to the quality of student life at the University;
 - Insuring that student-athletes are integral components of the general student population and are subject to the same academic and behavioral standards and expectations as other students;
 - Demonstrating a commitment to minority and gender equity through the composition of its coaching/administrative staff and a commitment to gender equity through sport participation opportunities, fiscal allocations and program support provisions;
 - Contributing to the positive public identity for the University through affiliation with respected athletic conferences, leagues and institutions;
 - Strengthening institutional image and pride within the University community and throughout the region;
 - Participating actively in community service activities throughout the local community; and
 - Providing, through a respected and successful athletics program, institutional assistance with student recruitment and enrollment; individual, alumni and corporate financial support; and positive institutional visibility.
- 3. The University President receives input from several sources to assess the success of the intercollegiate athletics program. The position receives regular reports from the Director of Athletics. The University's Intercollegiate Athletics Committee provides institutional oversight for intercollegiate athletics, and reviews/assesses the program. Its voting members include faculty representation from each of the University's six undergraduate colleges. The chair reports to the University President and provides periodic updates to the University Senate.
- 4. The Director of Athletics reports to the University President. This reflects the importance of presidential control of intercollegiate athletics, as emphasized in the report of the Knight Foundation's Commission on Intercollegiate Athletics. The Director of Athletics serves as a member of the President's Council.
- 5. The Department of Athletics, through its director, administrative staff and coaching staff, is expected to insure:
 - Adherence to NCAA and conference rules, policies and requirements;
 - Fiscal solvency and sound financial management practices;
 - Academic achievement of its student-athletes, consistent with that of the University's general student population;
 - Commitment to gender equity, minority equity and student-athlete welfare;

• Reasonable and continuing competitive success within its intercollegiate conference

The expectations were fulfilled satisfactorily and successfully during the 2009-10 year.

- The Department of Athletics has never been charged with a major NCAA rules infraction and has always been a member in good standing within its affiliated conferences. NCAA certification was granted in August of 2005.
- The FY09 NCAA audit confirmed an operating budget surplus of \$384,190.
- The Towson student-athletes continue to achieve at successful levels academically.
 - ✓ Team Grade Point Average (GPA) In the 2009-10 academic year, the average team GPA was 3.056 in the fall and 3.023 in the spring. In the fall semester, 56.1 percent of the 479 student-athletes had a 3.00 GPA or better. In the spring semester, 52.4 percent of the student-athletes had a 3.00 GPA or better.
 - ✓ Academic Progress Rate (APR) All 20 intercollegiate athletics programs have multiple year APR of 925 or better.
 - ✓ Graduation Rates In the most recent six-year graduation report, student-athletes that enrolled in the four-year class ending in 2003-04 graduated at a rate of 74.3 percent. The Towson general student population graduated at a rate of 69 percent over that same time period. The national average for Division I student-athletes over that same reporting period was 63 percent. Therefore, the Towson student-athletes graduated at a rate five percent higher than the Towson general student population and 10 percent higher than the national Division I student-athlete average.
- The Department of Athletics continues to monitor and advance its gender and diversity equity plans, which were compiled during the NCAA certification process. The plan and progress are reviewed annually by a subcommittee of the IAC.
- The 2009-10 athletics year was successful for the Tigers, highlighted by three teams defending conference championships:
 - ✓ The women's gymnastics team won its sixth straight ECAC championship and sent three individuals to the NCAA regional competition.
 - ✓ The women's swimming and diving team won its third straight CAA title, finishing ahead of runner-up UNC Wilmington by 158.5 points. Coach Pat Mead earned CAA Coach of the Year honors for the third straight year. Winning three events at the CAA Championships, Meredith Budner qualified for the NCAA Championships in three events and finished in the Top 10 in the 1650-meter freestyle and the 800-meter freestyle, earning All-America honors in both.
 - Towson University claimed its first ever Colonial Athletic Association Men's Golf Championship, winning the title by a comfortable 11 strokes over runner up William & Mary on The Homestead's par 70, 6,679-yard Cascade Course.
 - ✓ The women's lacrosse team posted a 13-5 record and made its third straight appearance in the NCAA Tournament. It was the first time in program history that the team qualified with an at-large bid.
 - ✓ Three (of eight possible) teams earned CAA Tournament berths. In addition to women's lacrosse, the other teams were men's lacrosse and softball.
 - ✓ Meredith Budner of the women's swimming and diving team and Hilary Fratzke from women's lacrosse earned earned all-America honors in 2009-10, while the men's and women's swimming team and the women's lacrosse team also earned academic all-America team honors.

6. The President has voting authority at the NCAA Convention. In 2010, he delegated Director of Athletics Mike Hermann to represent the institution at the NCAA Convention. Prior to the convention, with input from the Faculty Athletics Representative and the Director of Athletics, the University's position was determined. For standard legislation, the CAA provides information to the President, Faculty Athletics Representative and Director of Athletics. On legislation of particular concern to the President, he determines the University's voting position after input from the other parties. Otherwise, voting decisions are delegated to the FAR and Director of Athletics. The Director of Athletics is responsible for submitting institutional votes on legislative issues to the CAA.

In addition, Towson represents the CAA on three key NCAA committees. President Caret served on the Division I Presidential Advisory Group; Michael Hermann, director of athletics, served on the Division I Leadership Council; and Nance Reed, senior woman administrator and senior associate director of athletics, served on the NCAA Division I Championship and Sports Management Cabinet.

7. Towson University did not have NCAA investigations or significant rules infractions during the reporting period.

SECTION B

ADMISSIONS INFORMATION

TOWSON UNIVERSITY REGULAR AND SPECIAL TALENT ADMISSIONS GUIDELINES 2009 FALL CLASS

The following guidelines were used for students admitted to Towson University in Fall 2009:

1. <u>Regular Admit</u>: Any student who meets the University's regular guidelines shall be admitted as per those regulations. They needed at least a 3.0 GPA and a minimum SAT I total of 1650 for math, critical reading and writing.

Transfer applicants with fewer than 30 transferable credits must meet GPA and SAT I requirements for freshman applicants.

Transfer applicants with 30 or more transferable credits must submit transcripts from all colleges or universities attended. The regular admit standards are: minimum 2.00 GPA needed for 56 credits and above; other applicants are considered based on cumulative GPA and available space in the class.

- 2. <u>Talent Admit</u>: Any student designated as a "Talent" admit (as defined by the University Admissions Office) whose academic credentials are lower than the regular standards, but equal to or greater than an academic GPA of 2.80 and SAT I total of 1380 for math, critical reading and writing portions with a minimum of 420 in each section (19-20 on ACT) will be admitted through the "Talent Group Admit". This process shall include a review of the credentials (high school transcript and SAT I) by the Admissions Office. This review will be made by a designated admissions representative, who has the authority to admit a prospective student based on a credential review without supporting letters of recommendation. If the review reveals that the student is not a "good risk" (due to some unusual item on their record), has a decline in the most recent grades, or does not meet the above standards, then letters of recommendation will be requested in order for the student's file to be considered as a 'Talent Admit'. All "Talent Admit" students will be coded as an exception to the regular admissions standards in the student's admission file. A Transfer Student who does not meet the regular admit standards and has a minimum GPA of 2.00 and minimum of 24 credits may be considered in this category.
- 3. <u>Special Admit</u>: The admission of any "Special Admit" student whose academic standards are below either the Academic GPA of 2.80, or SAT I total of 1380 (with a minimum of 420 on the math, critical reading and writing portions or 19-20 on ACT) will upon request be reviewed and considered by the Athletic Department. In order for a student to be considered in the "Special Admit Group" admission process, there must be a letter of recommendation from a Towson University representative (coach or instructor) and all academic credentials must be up-to-date. All "Special" admit students will be coded as an "exception" to the regular admission standards and shall be so noted in the student's admission file.

A freshman "Special" applicant will not be considered for admission if his/her academic GPA is below NCAA core 2.2, or falls below the minimum SAT I combined total of 1230 in the math, critical reading and writing portions, or has less than a 400 on each portion. (17-18 on ACT). If the prospective student has a 4.0 GPA, he/she must have at least an 1170 for math and reading. If the student has a 3.9 GPA, he/she must have at least a 1210 for math and reading.

(For a prospective student-athlete to be considered, he / she must also be an NCAA Qualifier as documented by the NCAA Eligibility Center. The progress of student-athlete Special Admits are tracked each semester and reported to the Office of the Provost annually.) Transfer students may be considered for 'Special' admission. In these situations, a letter of recommendation will be required from the Towson representative along with a complete set of academic records. This includes all up-to-date transcripts from previous colleges and a high school transcript if the student has less than 30 earned credits at the time of review. Transfer student-athletes would have to have met all academic continuing eligibility requirements at the institution from which they are transferring in order for them to be admitted as a transfer student-athlete.

4. <u>Appeals to Admission</u>: A request for appeal to an Admissions decision must be initiated through the

appropriate TU department liaison for a student in the "Special Talent" category. Each Department has its own appeal process for extenuating circumstances. An appeal may also be made if additional academic information is obtained (such as new SAT I scores or updated grades).

5. If the applicant's appeal has been denied, the applicant may appeal to the President of the <u>University</u>. By the power of the office, the President has authority to make exceptions to the admissions criteria for any given year.

SECTION D FISCAL MATTERS

FISCAL MATTERS:

- 1. Revenue by source, and sport is provided in Table D.1*.
- 2. Expenditures by expense categories is provided in Table D.2*.
- 3. The athletic fee for full-time students enrolled at Towson University was \$730 for FY 2009 and \$751 for FY 2010. Part-time students paid \$22.00 per credit hour in FY 2009 and \$23.00 per credit hour in FY 2010.
- 4. The athletic fee is the primary funding source for the Department of Athletics. The Director of Athletics recommends the athletic fee to the University President via the Office of Administration and Finance. The Board of Regents provides final approval to A& F. The annual increase in athletic fee generally reflects the percentage increase of university tuition and fees. Students pay the athletic fee based on their status as a full-time (enrolled in a minimum of 12 credits) or a part-time student. The individuals involved in the determination of the athletic fee include: Director of Athletics, applicable staff in the Office of Administration and Finance, the University President, and the Intercollegiate Athletics Committee. In return for paying the athletic fee, students are allowed admission without charge to all institutional ticketed athletics events.
- 5. The total mandatory fee assumed in FY 2009 was \$2,134. The athletic fee represents 34.21% of the mandatory fee. For FY 2010, the mandatory fee was \$2,238. The athletic fee represents 33.56% of the mandatory fee.
- 6. Total athletic revenues for FY 2009 totaled \$14,873,007. The athletic fee revenue represented \$13,168,061 (88.54%) of total revenues. For FY 2010, the total revenues were \$15,930,752 of which \$13,825,962 (86.79%) was generated via the athletic student fee.
- 7. The Department of Athletics fund balance information for FY 2009 and FY 2010 is provided below:
