

TOPIC: FY 2013 System Funded Construction Program Request

<u>COMMITTEE</u>: Finance

DATE OF COMMITTEE MEETING: June 19, 2012

<u>SUMMARY</u>: This is a request for approval of the FY 2013 System Funded Construction Program in the amount of \$161,736,000 that is the first year of the proposed FY 2013-2017 System Funded Construction Program of \$562,766,000, as indicated in the attachment. The USM Auxiliary Bond portion of the total is \$87,791,000 for FY2013 and a five year total of \$410,766,000. Given the state of the economy and the difficulty in securing developer interest, there are no requests recommended for private financing this cycle, though that decision will be revisited if circumstances change.

The request includes projects proposed for planning, construction and/or equipment funding in FY 2013. As noted above, most are recommended for funding through external borrowing in whole or in part. Approval is being requested concurrently and/or at a later date for borrowing authority for those specific projects. There may be changes at that time as a result of timing, cost, fee change implications, or other considerations. Each project is a part of an institutional program that will produce the revenue required for repaying the debt.

Some recommendations in the SFCP may be conditional upon satisfactory completion of other projects or activities. These are noted in the attachment or will be part of concurrent discussion with the Board. One project, a dormitory project at Coppin State University, will be financed through an internal loan by the System. Terms will be negotiated by agreement between the institution and the System Office.

<u>ALTERNATIVE(S)</u>: Each project can be reviewed separately and accepted, modified, or rejected. The institutional requirement and financial viability for each project were evaluated separately.

<u>FISCAL IMPACT</u>: The impact of the program focuses on the effect of each project on the institution's operating budget and varies with the plan for setting the charges required to repay the debt.

CHANCELLOR'S RECOMMENDATION: That the Committee on Finance recommend that the Board of Regents approve the FY 2013 System Funded Construction Program request with the conditions listed herein (and within the attached materials) and authorize the Chancellor to make appropriate changes consistent with existing Board policies and guidelines. Any such changes will be reported to the Committee on Finance.

*The MCEC figures shown are estimates only. The Maryland Clean Energy Center (MCEC) is a quasi-state entity created under Governor O'Malley with state bonding authority. Their purpose is to promote clearency economic development and jobs in the state. Under the Shared Savings Agreement, USM Institutions will pay annually from their operating budgets a percentage of their avoided energy/water costs. MCEC will use these payments to pay bond holders. If savings do not cover bond payments in any year, the Energy Service Company that contracted with MCEC will be responsible for the difference. Again, these are presented for project approval only.
