TOPIC: Results of Periodic Reviews of Academic Programs

COMMITTEE: Education Policy and Student Life

DATE OF COMMITTEE MEETING: January 12, 2016

<u>SUMMARY</u>: At its meeting in June 2003, the Board of Regents delegated to the Chancellor the authority to approve institutional reports on the review of existing academic programs. Existing academic programs are required to submit a report every seven years. Each USM institution follows a review process that was approved previously by the Regents. A format for the reports is standardized and includes information on enrollments and degrees awarded, internal and external reviews, and institutional recommendations and actions.

Drafts of each report are reviewed by staff in the USM Office of the Senior Vice Chancellor for Academic Affairs and comments are shared with the institutions for appropriate action prior to final submission to the Chancellor. Comments may include requests for additional information or the need for additional action following program accreditation reviews.

The reports demonstrated the seriousness with which the reviews are taken. Institutional action plans are decided upon primarily by the provost or dean, both of whom are responsible to monitor academic quality and productive use of resources. The attached table provides data on enrollment and degrees awarded during the five years prior to the submission of the report.

Program Accreditation

Coppin State University

The American Association of Collegiate Nursing Education (CCNE) has granted the Nursing bachelor's program continuing accreditation through 2025; the master's program through 2023; and the Postgraduate APRN initial accreditation through 2025.

Towson University

All teacher education programs met all National Council for Accreditation of Teacher Education (NCATE) standards at both the initial and advanced levels without any recommendations for improvement and have earned continuing accreditation until Fall 2021. Additionally, all programs reviewed as a part of the NCATE Specialized Professional Association process were recognized by their respective SPAs.

Low Degree Productivity

MHEC Definition

Bachelors: < 5 in most recent year or a total of 15 in last three years Masters: < 2 in most recent year or a total of 6 in last three years Doctorate: < 1 in most recent year or a total of 3 in last three years

By this definition, five programs would be considered "low productivity."

Coppin State University

Global Studies (B): The program needs to increase enrollment and degree production over the next two years or risk potential suspension or elimination at the recommendation of the CSU Curriculum Policy and Standards Committee. As a strategy for growth, there are plans to offer the program at USMH. It is expected that the outreach will begin in the fall of 2016. The University is also in the process of creating Guaranteed Admissions Agreements with both Hagerstown Community College and Frederick Community College. The program is also planning to establish reverse transfer agreements with both colleges during the 2015-2016 academic year.

Towson University

Earth-Space Science (B) and Geology (B): Due to the declining workforce need (ESS teachers), faculty are considering incorporating the ESS program as a concentration within the Geology major which by definition is also "low productivity." The Geology faculty will also seek to increase transfer student enrollments through articulation agreements with community colleges. The graduation rates in both cases are in line with the number of majors.

University of Maryland Eastern Shore

African American Studies (B): The department will begin the plan to phase out the major beginning in the Spring 2016 semester while strengthening the minor.

History: The department faculty have decided to reduce the requirements from 79 credits in the major to 42 credits, bringing it into alignment with other programs, which may help to improve enrollments and degree completion.
