

University System of Maryland Board of Regents December 22, 2009

Minutes of the Public Session

A. Chairman Kendall called the Special meeting of the University System of Maryland Board of Regents to order at 8:00 a.m. on Tuesday, December 22, 2009 at University System of Maryland, Elkins Building, Adelphi. B. Committee of the Whole

- 1. Chancellor Kirwan presented the Memorandums of Understanding for Restructuring of UMBI: (a) Center of Marine Biotechnology (COMB); (b) Institute of Fluorescence (IOF); and (c) Center for Biosystems Research (CBR). (Moved by Chairman Kendall; seconded by Regent Gossett; unanimously approved.)
