

## BOARD OF REGENTS COMMITTEE ON ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT AND TECHNOLOGY COMMERCIALIZATION Minutes of the Public Session

November 21, 2013 University of Maryland, Baltimore County

The Committee on Economic Development and Technology Commercialization of the University System of Maryland (USM) Board of Regents met in public session on Thursday, November 21, 2013 in the Albin O. Kuhn Library of the University of Maryland, Baltimore County.

1. Featured Start-Up -- OmniSpeech (Information Item)

Dr. Carol Espy-Wilson, professor of Electrical and Computer Engineering at UMCP, presented highlights of the products, technology, investment received, and strategies of the company that she founded, OmniSpeech. The company, which offers innovative software solutions to enhance voice communications in digital mobile devices and speech-enabled applications, was founded in 2009 with assistance from the Venture Accelerator Program at the University of Maryland.

OmniSpeech has received numerous awards, including the SAIC Venture Accelerator award, NSF SBIR Phase I and Phase II grants, UMD Mtech Business Plan Competition winner, and Maryland Technology Development Corporation (TEDCO) award. In addition, OmniSpeech has garnered approximately \$2 million in angel investments.
