**From Baltimore, Washington, D.C., and
Alexandria, Virginia (140 miles)**

Take appropriate route to Chesapeake Bay Bridge. Continue on Rt. 50 East to Salisbury, Maryland, to Rt. 13 South to Princess Anne.

From Philadelphia (150 miles)

Take I-95 South to I-495 via exit 11 toward Port of Wilmington/Baltimore. I-495 South becomes I-95 South. Merge onto DE 1 South via exit 4A toward Christiana Mall Road. Take US 13 exit number 97 toward Salisbury/Norfolk.

Follow signs to Maryland Route 822, UMES Boulevard. Turn left onto 822, traveling approx. 3/4 mile to campus, where you can travel left or right. Left takes you to the residence halls, gym, library, and agricultural complex. For J.T. Williams Bldg, turn right and then go straight to the stop sign at the Hytche Blvd intersection. Go straight across the intersection and pass Kiah Hall, the Henson Center, and Hazel Hall. Lot M is on your left and J.T. Williams is next to Lot M.

From New York (240 miles) and points North
Rt. 95 South to the New Jersey Turnpike, across Delaware Memorial Bridge and follow signs to Rt. 13 South (Dover, Delaware, or Norfolk, Virginia).

Stay on Route 13 South to Princess Anne, and follow signs to Maryland Route 822, UMES Boulevard. (Continue as above from UMES Boulevard.)

Stay on Route 13 South to Princess Anne, and follow signs to Maryland Route 822, UMES Boulevard. (Continue as above from UMES Boulevard.)

From North and South Carolina (450-500 miles)
Rt. 85, to Rt. 58, to Rt. 17 (Norfolk, Virginia) to Rt. 13 North. Cross the Chesapeake Bay Bridge and Tunnel.

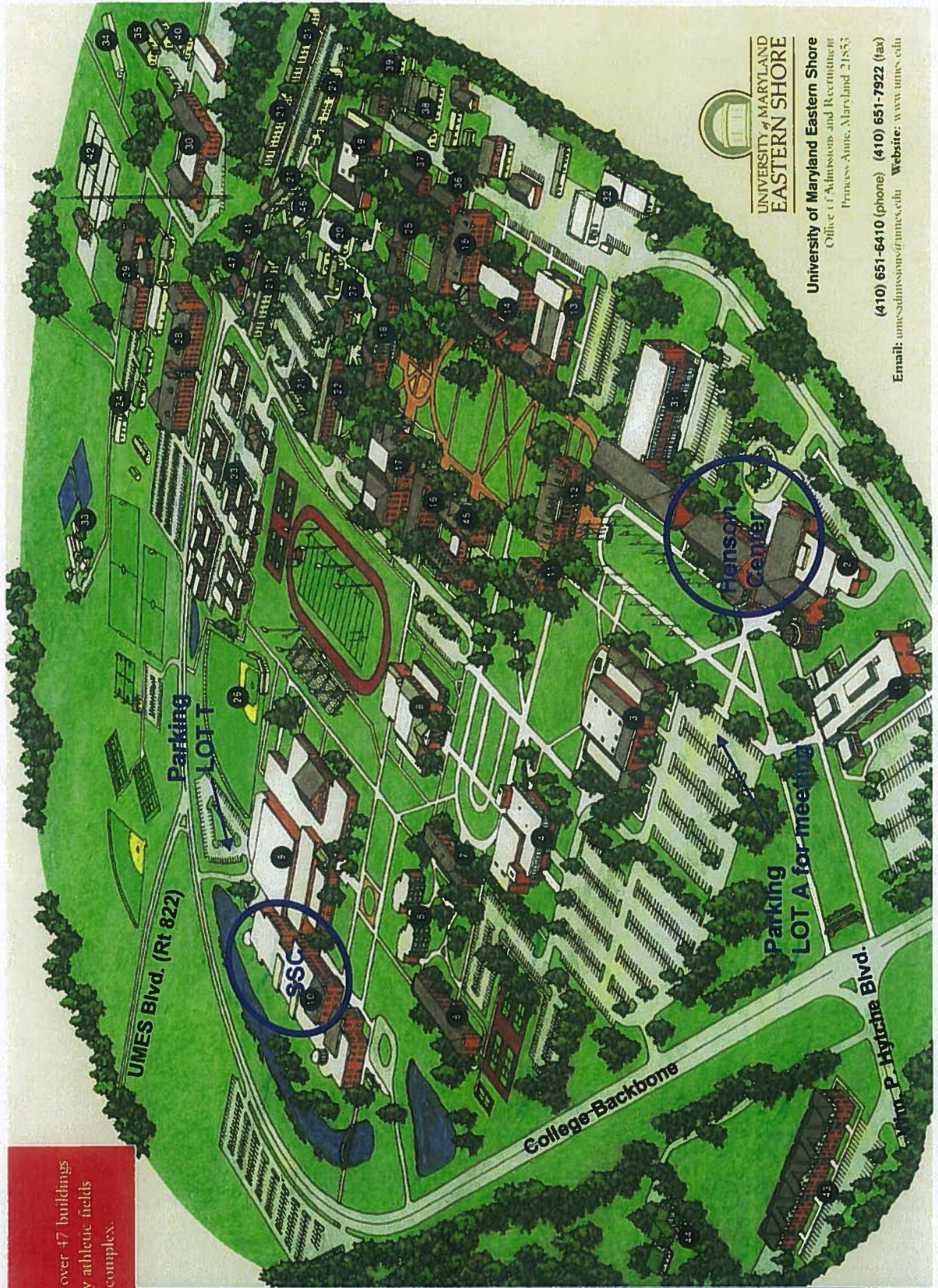
Follow signs to Maryland. Pass through Pocomoke City, Maryland, on Rt. 13 North to Princess Anne. Follow signs to Somerset Ave., MD-675. Take right on Wm. P. Hytche Boulevard (second light in Princess Anne). Cross railroad tracks to enter campus.
