2017 Langenberg Lecture and Symposium April 19, 2017 University of Maryland, Baltimore

On April 10, the USM and USM Foundation will host the Langenberg Lecture and Symposium, at the University of Maryland Baltimore, featuring **The Honorable Barbara Mikulski**. The theme of the lecture and symposium "Civic Education, Civic Engagement, and Civic Responsibility: Foundations of a Democratic Society," will be addressed through a series of discussion groups and panels during the day, including a lunch time panel, moderated by Dean Lucy Dalglish, James Merrill College of Journalism, University of Maryland, College Park, and featuring Brian Stelter, senior media correspondent for CNN and the host of "Reliable Sources;" Allan Miller, CEO of the News Literacy Project; and Hannah Cole-Chu, third-year student at the University of Maryland Francis King Carey School of Law, and Editor in Chief of the Maryland Law Review.

The Symposium is co-sponsored by the Maryland Higher Education Commission, the Maryland Independent College and University Association, the Maryland Association of Community Colleges, and the Maryland State Department of Education and is intended to reinforce a commitment to civic education as a mission-critical responsibility for educators from pre-school through graduate school (P-20).

Every college and university in the state (public and private) has been invited to bring a team of 3-5 faculty and educational leaders from their respective campuses, representing general education faculty, teacher education faculty, deans or provosts, and student affairs leaders or vice presidents. The general audience will also include regents and presidents of institutions, and leaders of public schools (superintendents, principals and teachers).
