### OERs: Why, Results, Pros, and Cons

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
#### Results: 1st OER Basic Arithmetic Summer 2016

- Summer 2015 (non-OER)
- Day class: 20/24 = 83%.
- Night class: 13/17 = 77%
- Totals: 33/41 = 81%

- Summer 2016 (OER/MOM)
- Day class: 12/14 = 86%
- Night class: 13/19 = 68%
- Totals: 25/33 = 76%

Same 2 sections, same instructors.

### Basic Arithmetic Text Costs




### **Results: Digging Deeper**

- Again, spring 2017 Mat
  91 had 7 F2F OER
  sections.
- 55/105 = 52% passed.
- Comparing the exact same 7 sections from spring (non-OER) 2016.
  55/102 = 54% passed.

I especially like those numbers when you consider it was the first Mat 91 semester and it was offered thru Canvas.
