Overview of the Connection with students

<u>Mental health</u>: Students need more mental health services to deal with the effects of <u>covid</u> and other life-altering concerns. Students are requesting more support from faculty and staff during this time. Support from faculty and staff is still a significant request from students. In an earlier report, we asked faculty and staff to empathize with students and be more aware of students going through challenging times.

Mental health concerns will always be a topic in any system or workplace; I request that the University System of Maryland ensure that mental health will always be a top priority for all students.
